Children and Young People's Climate Charter

Glasgow City Council declared a Climate Emergency in May 2019. Climate Change is the greatest challenge of our lifetime, and one with implications for all. It threatens the realisation of children's rights across the globe.

Glasgow's Children and Young People's Climate Charter: Engage the World to Change the World, is an intergenerational declaration, promise and challenge. It supports the City's Council, citizens, partners, children and young people to be compassionate, responsible and effective citizens developing the skills, knowledge and attributes for an equitable, just and sustainable world. It inspires all to become climate and carbon literate and empowers our children and young people to play an active role in the climate emergency.

The Charter is an agreement between the Council, citizens, partners and the city's children and young people. It sets out our values and how we will work together to tackle the climate crisis. It highlights each generation's responsibility to ensure the protection of rights for the next. The charter forms part of a way of working that we will continue to develop together.

The intergenerational signatories of this Charter declare a duty of care to:

- protect children and young people against the impacts of climate change;
- commit to a legacy of intergenerational equity;
- promote strong connections with our children and young people;
- support the missions to take action on climate change and Engage the World to Change the World.

Learning for sustainability (LfS) is an approach to life and learning which enables learners, educators, schools and their wider communities to build a socially-just, sustainable and equitable society. An effective whole school and community approach to LfS weaves together global citizenship, sustainable development education and outdoor learning to create coherent, rewarding and transformative learning experiences.'

Uniting the World to Tackle Climate Change





IN PARTNERSHIP WITH ITALY

COP26 (26th Conference of the Parties) UN Climate Change Summit will be held in Glasgow from Sunday 31st October to Friday 12th November 2021.

'The COP26 summit will bring parties together to accelerate action towards the goals of the

Paris Agreement and the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change.' The UK will work with all countries and join with civil society, companies and communities to inspire climate action ahead of COP26. Each of us has a part to play in the UK's year of climate change. That's why, in the run up to the summit, the UK government will be working closely with businesses, civil society groups, schools and people across the UK as part of the conversation on tackling climate change.

Many people from all over the UK are already doing their bit on climate change, from the engineers working on the offshore wind farms now powering our homes and businesses, to local initiatives encouraging children and parents to walk to school.

Glasgow has been described as the 'perfect place' to host COP 26. The 'Dear Green Place' has set a target to be carbon neutral by 2030 and 'aims to be one of the greenest cities in Europe through its Sustainable Glasgow campaign, and is 4th in the world in the Global Destination Sustainability Index.' The UK is partnering with Italy to host COP26. It is putting climate change and the reversal of bio-diversity loss at the heart of the 2021 agenda.

The Youth Summit 'Youth Climate: Driving Ambition' and the PreCop26 will be held in Milan 28th - 30th September and 30th September - 2nd October respectively. 'We will work with our international partners, and through our Presidencies, in support of a green and resilient recovery that promotes sustainable growth and jobs and delivers for those most vulnerable to the impacts of climate change.'

Education Services

As educators working in Glasgow, this is an amazing opportunity for all our young people, schools and wider communities to engage fully and further develop their Learning for Sustainability work and to ensure, as practitioners, that we are meeting the standards and delivering on our young people's entitlements.

There will be opportunities over this session, next and on-going, to access resources, attend information events and training, linking to all aspects of LfS and for young people to become involved in projects and competitions, both within and out with school, and to showcase their knowledge, understanding and opinions.

We will be asking all establishments to have the same focus on the lead up to the COP26 in November. We will focus in Glasgow on three of the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

These are:







These SDGs are not new work for Glasgow establishments, but part of on-going developments in Learning for Sustainability and support action points in Glasgow Education's Learning for Sustainability Action Plan. They include work on the following:

- Planned learning on what Climate Change is and how human activity has affected our environment.
- Climate Justice and how some communities, countries and societies are more adversely affected by climate change than others.
- To continue work on reduce, reuse and recycle in relation to litter (plastics), food waste, food growing, consumption and carbon emissions.
- Renewable energy and how technology and changing habits can help us live in a more sustainable way.
- Understanding our local environment and the environment in other world areas.
 Habitats, bio-diversity and interdependence and how to support local bio-diversity.



COP26 Outcomes

We aim to achieve the following outcomes:

- All young people in Glasgow will know what climate justice and climate change is and actions that can be taken (age and stage appropriate).
- All young people will have the skills, knowledge and attributes to take decisions that will lessen the impact on the environment.
- All practitioners will develop their understanding of, and include in their teaching practice, Sustainable Development Goal 13, 16 and 10 (and other Global Goals as appropriate).

Legacy

The legacy of our ongoing work will be:

- All education establishments will uphold the child's entitlement to learning about sustainable development and uphold their right to Article 29 (goals of education).
- All practitioners will have an increased understanding of Learning for Sustainability, their role in delivering this entitlement and their understanding of the Sustainable Development Goals, (SDGs) plea.
- Existing and new resources, information and guidance will support all
 establishments to further develop their whole school approach to Learning
 for Sustainability and support all practitioners to ensure they are delivering
 Learning for Sustainability through their own learning and teaching.
- Young People and families in Glasgow can and do make sustainable choices supported by their wider community, local and national government departments and agencies to live sustainable lifestyles as informed and committed global citizens.




Social Studies Framework





Switch Off Fortnight



Switch Off Fortnight 2021 takes place during COP26, from 8—21st November, allowing school communities to contribute to conversations around climate change. Glasgow schools could join over 650 schools across the UK (and counting) who have already signed up to take part.

Schools will receive free practical support, learning resources and information to help students understand what net zero is, why COP26 matters, and what steps they can take to reduce their energy use.

Through participation, schools can:

- Measure the impact of 'switching off' on school energy use.
- Contribute to helping the UK reach its net zero targets.
- Choose to use school technology, appliances and resources efficiently.
- Reduce school energy consumption and bills.
- Enable young people to consider how their actions have a bigger impact on the planet.
- Inspire pupils and staff to make positive changes to their behaviour both at school and home.

Every Tree Tells a Story

We would like you to tell us a story about a tree in your life. This can be a tree you see every day on your way to school, trees in a park or wood, a tree that reminds you of a different place. Does someone in your family tell an interesting story about a tree?

All trees are different and many of the great storytellers have used trees in their tales. Storytelling can take different forms. You can draw, write, or (with the permission of an adult) record your story. It can be short or long but it must feature a tree because, "every tree tells a story".

This project is inspired by COP26. Let's get children to think about trees and what they mean. What stories do children, families, community members have about trees? Let's create an opportunity to record this by whatever means children choose to express themselves: photos, pictures, writing, vlogs, short films
